








7 Top Tips to Support Key Stage 2 Children Reading at Home



Shared reading is a great way to develop children's language and communication and to  during school closures—these tips are aimed at supporting children in Key Stage 2.


1 Concentrate on reading quality (it isn't all about reading lots!)  



